



## 3 Point Plan to End Corruption

The Grisham/Delta scandal exposed how New Mexico law makers have abused their power to bilk tax-payers out of millions—charging our sickest New Mexicans more—while lining their pockets. It must stop. If New Mexico is ever going to climb out of being last in jobs, education & health, we must make major changes to clean up corruption. As your Governor, I will immediately work with the Legislature, Secretary of State and Attorney General to implement a 3 point plan to end corruption.

1. Prohibit Elected Officials From Having State Contracts

Elected officials, their immediate families and the companies they work for, own or that pay dividends to them may not receive a contract paid out of funds controlled by the State of New Mexico.

2. Require Release of Tax Returns When Filing

At the time of filing their nominating petitions, all candidates for state office must file the most recent 4 years of state and federal tax returns. And on April 16<sup>th</sup> of an election year, candidates must also file returns from the previous calendar year. The Secretary of State shall post all candidate tax returns on their website within 5 days of being filed.

3. Searchable Database Cross-Indexing Campaign Donations With Bills Sponsored

When New Mexico voters pass the Ethics Commission, it shall be tasked to provide a searchable, on-line database showing the amounts of donations made to sponsors of legislative bills from donors, businesses and PACs whose occupations and interests are affected by that bill. This information should be made available within 2 days of a bill being filed, and should also include independent PAC expenditures made relating to that bill.
